# Membership

# FALL CONFERENCE

The three day conference was held September 14-16 in the fall for the first time and provided CM credits in all four required categories. Attendance was somewhat down from past conference, but attendees heard presentations from keynote speakers Craig Bennett and Petra Hurtado, PhD.



# SPRING WORKSHOP

An all day workshop was held on March 9th with keynote speaker Ilana Preuss, author of "Recast Your City, How to Save Your Downtown with Small-Scale Manufacturing". The day included an interview with Ilana on her book, panel discussion with individuals representing small scale manufacturing businesses and maker spaces, lunch presentation by Ilana, and a hands on workshop.



# BOOKED ON PLANNING PODCAST

The Chapter launched the Booked on Planning Podcast in January with the assistance of the Chapter Presidents Council Grant. The show has contributed to the continuing education of not only our chapter and the American Planning Association membership, but to the design field in general. In our first year we recorded 25 episodes and exceed 8,000 downloads with the top episodes getting over 400 downloads each.
